Materials

- Small tin can (I used tomato paste)
- Colour printer and paper / card
- Glue
- Scissors / cutting knife

Instructions

1. Prepare your tin by ensuring its clean.
2. Print label onto light card / paper. (I used cheap gloss photo paper for a shiny finish).
3. Cut and glue label onto tin can.
4. Place toothpicks inside your tin and put in a prominent position on your kitchen bench or table. (My toothpicks were a bit short for the tin, so I cut out some circles the same size as the tin using corrugated cardboard from a vegetable box. I nestled them inside the tin on top of one another for extra height).
